
The response we are getting from the leaders, kids, and parents has been overwhelmingly positive!

If you have begun attending FCC in the past year or so, Paul would love to get all of you together and talk about Faith Community Church. What are we about? What is happening here? How do I get plugged in? And if you have questions, he will be happy to try to answer them. This class will run 2 weeks: October 22 and 29. In the Multi-Purpose Room from 9:15 - 10:15. October is Adoption Awareness Month. The earliest recorded history of legal adoptions is in the code of Hammurabi in 1750 B.C. In Ancient Rome, adoption was a fairly common practice as people often took in abandoned children from the street. It wasn't until the Middle Ages when orphanages, as we know them, became mainstream. The importance of bloodlines and inheritance during this time period made adoptions unlikely and often not allowed. So, the church took on a greater role in caring for orphans. In 1909, Teddy Roosevelt endorsed the notion that orphans should be raised by families, and that is how the modern foster care system got started. Many have heard of the orphan trains that brought children west.

You might not know that there are 391,000 children in the US foster system. More than 5,000 in Nebraska alone. There are an estimated 153 million orphans around the world today. These children are the most vulnerable in our global society. Our Heavenly Father cares for each of these

and encourages us to do the same. What we have received, we must give to others. God loves us, so we love. God gives us mercy, so we give mercy. God has adopted us as His own dear children. How can we do the same? James 2:16 challenges us. We say, "I pray you are warm and filled," but we do nothing to warm and fill them. Isaiah 1:17(ESV) says, "Learn to do good; seek justice, correct oppression; bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause." I pray you will take this to heart. Pray for the children, seek justice for them, do the good things you have prayed they receive from others.

We wanted to make you aware of a recent change in how our church will send text messages. Our heart is to stay connected and communicate effectively with our church family. While we intentionally limit the number of texts we send out, we also know it is a great option to have available

This number only allows the church to send text messages; it does NOT have the ability to receive messages. We hope this serves the church family as we seek to stay connected.
